Who We Serve

Over 22% of Illinois residents speak a language other than English at home. Over 5% of adults in Illinois have under a 9th grade education and the current high school graduation rate is 85%. The need for Adult Education in Illinois is great, and we're here to help you serve your community!

- Help their child with homework
- Read with their child

Project READ learners are diverse; they are professionals, unemployed folks, laborers, and homemakers. Some loved school, some dreaded it and some did not have the opportunity to attend school at all! All of them have decided to put time and energy into learning at this point in their life. All have a role in our community and in the lives of the people around them. They bring the value of their experiences and motivations to the learning process. Tutors learn just as much from the tutoring experience as learners, and the spirit of cooperation strengthens our community.

How We Help

Project READ volunteers provide free basic literacy, basic math, or ESL tutoring to adults in public settings or in Adult Ed Classrooms. Our organization needs volunteers who are able to commit to 14 hours of in-person and on-line training, and then are able to meet with a learner approximately 2 hours a week. We hope tutors and learners can work together for about a year. Goal-setting with students, subject instruction, soft skill coaching, time keeping, finding new materials, and keeping in communication with Project READ staff are all important components of being a tutor.

Project READ gives you the support and training you need so you are best prepared to work with learners toward their goals. Many of our tutors say the time they spend tutoring is the most rewarding part of their week! Project READ is made possible by a grant awarded by the Illinois State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State, using funds designated for literacy. We are supported by Parkland College Adult Education. Together, we have provided quality educational support to adult learners in this area since 1984.

Why Project READ?

As a Project READ volunteer tutor, you will have the opportunity to:

- Make a difference in a person's life
- Use a skill or talent
- Gain professional experience
- Meet friendly, action-minded people

- 14 hours of training and observation opportunities prior to certification.
