Unclaimed Cash and Property I-Cash Program - Save the Date!

We are excited to share that a rep from the Illinois State Treasure's Office will be at Moyer for an I-Cash Program. All are welcome. Drop in on Tuesday, October 27th from 2-5 p.m. to see if you are owed money. This program is free and run directly by the State of Illinois. The representative will check records for you.

From the Treasure's Office:

In Ford County, an estimated 16,000 people and/or businesses have unclaimed cash or property held by the treasurer's office. The value exceeds \$2,200,000.00. Illinois State Treasurer Michael W. Frerichs is encouraging Area Residents to attend this I-Cash event.

"For most people, it is difficult to believe that they might have overlooked an investment account or forgot to pick up a final paycheck. However, the thousands of names in our database shows that it happens too often," Frerichs said. "This money belongs to the residents of Illinois. It should be in their bank accounts rather than the state's safe."
